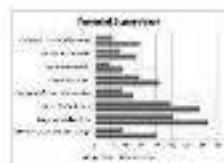

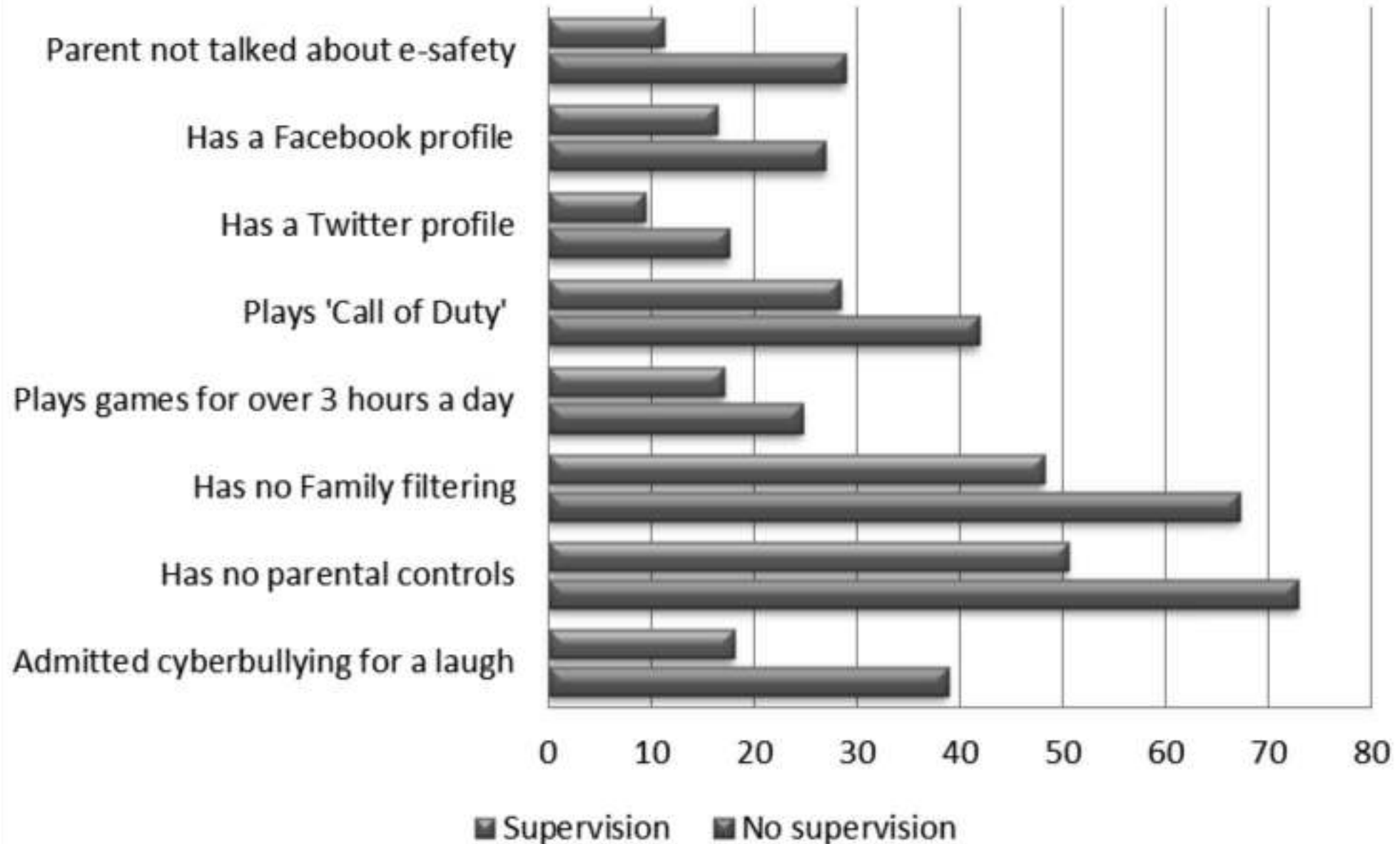

- Who will they talk to for help and support?
- Use blocking and reporting tools
